OVERVIEW:

The mission of the Louisiana Department of Health (LDH) is to protect and promote health and to ensure access to medical, preventive, and rehabilitative services for all Louisiana residents. LDH's core values reflect the belief that every individual has the right to live with dignity, be served with compassion, and have a choice when it comes to how they will receive care and where they want to live. It is LDH's vision that every Louisiana resident is able to access the right care, at the right time, in the right place.

LDH is committed to ensuring that individuals and their families have access to necessary compassionate, evidence-based, and resolutionfocused treatments and support delivered by a behavioral health system that is coordinated, responsive, and efficient.

By addressing the needs of all populations, including the most vulnerable residents, LDH believes improvements to its behavioral health system of care will allow people to remain in their communities and reduce the need for restrictive levels of care, including nursing homes, jails, and hospitals. These improvements include supporting the workforce to deliver care that improves the health, including the behavioral health, of individuals and families who need these services. It is the Department's goal to develop a system of care that is personcentered, regardless of the care setting.

During these quarterly calls, LDH representatives will provide relevant updates to PASRR programming. The LDH team is committed to strong partnerships with stakeholders across the state and is making themselves available to answer questions about PASRR in an effort to improve referral processes and service linkages for those in need.

Facilities and practitioners who aid individuals seeking nursing facility placement and those individuals discharging to the community can ask questions and present scenarios that may be insightful for the entire aroup.

MEET YOUR LDH FACULTY:

Tammy Chaisson, OAAS Level 1, is the Medical Certification Manager with the Office of Aging and Adult Services at LDH. Before employment with LDH in July 2011, Chaisson worked four years as a support coordinator for Medical Resources and Guidance and Volunteers of America. She has a Bachelor of Science with a concentration in family and child studies. She worked in the public school system for four years as an elementary school teacher. During the last 15 years, her passion has been working with the disabled and elderly population.

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MEET YOUR FACULTY CONTINUED

Summer Chaves, LPC-S, OBH Level II, is a Program Manager for LDH Office of Behavioral Health (OBH). Since graduating with her master's degree in community counseling from Louisiana State University, Chaves has worked with a variety of high-risk, high-need populations, including severely and persistently mentally ill adults and high-risk children and adolescents. She began her career working with adults with severe and persistent mental illness in a variety of settings, including partial hospitalization programs, intensive outpatient programs, mental health rehabilitation programs, and Assertive Community Treatment Teams. In these settings, she provided frontline treatment and clinical and program management. After leaving direct client care, she worked for a Medicaid managed care organization for five years. Chaves worked with medical directors to establish best practices for reviewing and evaluating medical-necessity criteria and individual needs for a variety of behavioral health services and PASRR evaluations. Currently, she oversees the PASRR Level II program housed in OBH and is the primary point of contact for the PASRR Level II program.

Ann Darling, LCSW, OBH Level II, My Choice LA, is a Program Director for OBH. Since graduating with her master's degree in social work from Louisiana State University, Darling has led the implementation of a number of evidence-based practices for adults with serious mental illness living in the community, including employment programs, peer support, and assertive community treatment services. She is lead on a number of activities associated with Louisiana's Agreement to Resolve the DOJ Investigation related to individuals with mental illness living in nursing facilities. This includes the Louisiana Crisis Response System, PASRR Level II operations, and the My Choice Louisiana transition coordination program in OBH.

Tanya Murphy, OCDD Level II, is the Regional Operations Director for the Office for Citizens with Developmental Disabilities (OCDD). Murphy has a bachelor's degree in psychology from Chadron State College in Chadron, Nebraska. Previously, she worked for the Department of Family Services as a child abuse investigator and family reunification social worker in Rock Springs, Wyoming. She began working at OCDD in 1998 and has twenty-four years of experience in all aspects of the OCDD service system. Murphy currently serves as the OCDD liaison and lead accountability plan monitor for all ten Human Service Districts/Authorities across Louisiana.
